APPROACH:

Make close to Conwy *Fairway* Spherical (R.W.V.S.) buoy (53°17'.94N 003°55'.53W) , then follow buoyed channel. Keep within 20 m of each buoy taking particular care in the region of the Scabs; give Morfa Conwy (Perch) 50 m clearance. Channel buoys have radar reflectors.

Past Beacons Jetty keep to stbd., past Conwy Marina (to stbd.) and turn to port into buoyed channel as marina entrance opens. Access is controlled by a drop gate cill with access approximately \pm 3hrs. HW. Maintained depths of approx. 3.2m seaward of the pier, 2.2m to landward of bridge to shore.

DANGERS

Drying patches to north and south of leading line from *Fairway* buoy. Banks dry, channel has little water at less than half tide. In strong SW to N winds, seas break on West Spit. Spring ebb runs at 5 knots through moorings and approach channel. Entrance channel dries. River dries in places and banks move constantly. Follow the locals and watch for privately laid channel markers.

SHELTER

Completely protected.

LIGHTS & MARKS

See 3.5.2 for details of marks. Channel from Morfa Conwy beacon is buoyed past Conwy Marina entrance to Bodlondeb Point. Three lit Port hand buoys mark the approach to the marina and three yellow buoys mark the stbd extremity of safe water. A deep water holding buoy is available for early/late arrivals.

FACILITIES

Conwy town, with castle, is a fascinating place to visit.
 Nearest rail, Llandudno Junction (2 miles). Good road links via A55 Expressway.
 Marina has 200 berths with usual on-site facilities. NO dedicated visitors' berths.
 Access to pontoons controlled by security gate.

NOTES

Contact "Deganwy Marina" on Ch. 80 before entering approach channel to establish whether a berth is available. If possible contact in advance.
